Delivering Unpriced or Warehoused Grain

Contractual Issues

- Contact SQP immediately if you have any production or quality concerns that may affect your ability to deliver against your current commitment;
- If you are unable to deliver against any fixed tonnage contract/s (for pool and/or fixed price), SQP will need to undertake a contract renegotiation;
- Be aware of the delivery tolerance on your contracts. SQP contracts are all min/max, i.e. zero tolerance.

Canola Oil Bonifications – 1.5% premium or deduction for each 1% above or below 42%.

E.g. For a contract with a net port price \$400/mt:

- 41.5% oil: $-0.5 \times 1.5\% \times \$400 = \$3.20/\text{mt}$ deduction
- 43.0% oil: $+1.0 \times 1.5\% \times \$400 = \$6.00/\text{mt}$ bonus

Remember: it is best to deliver your higher-oil tickets against your higher-value contracts. 43.0% oil against a \$400/mt contract is \$6/mt bonus versus \$4.95/mt for a \$330/mt contract.

SQP strongly encourages members to utilise the online services provided by the bulk-handling companies (BHCs). This allows you to transfer grain to SQP prior to payment of any outstanding storage fees. Conversely, if you use the paper transfer forms, the title of grain cannot be transferred to SQP until all outstanding balances are paid in full.

If you wish to outload grain ex-BHC warehouse, you are obliged to pay ALL receival, storage and outloading costs before you can access your grain. You are also only entitled to the shrunk tonnage held in store (0.5% discount) - not the initial tonnage delivered. We would discourage members from this process, and encourage you to contact SQP with any warehouse pricing enquiries.

ABA to accept GM canola at three sites this harvest

Australian Bulk Alliance today announced it will receive conventional canola and Round Up ready (GM) canola at three of its grain receival sites in Victoria and southern New South Wales this coming harvest.

ABA general manager, Simon McNair, said the move reflected grower and market acceptance and demand for Round Up ready (GM) canola after the 2008 decision by the Victorian and New South Wales governments to lift bans on growing GM canola.

“In response to that demand, ABA will be operating the two Australian Oilseed Federation receival standards CSO1 (grade CANG) and CSO1-A (grade CANO) at selected sites this coming harvest,” Mr McNair said.

“At sites with the CSO1 standard we will receive both conventional and Round Up ready canola; at CSO1-A sites we will only accept conventional canola.”

Mr McNair said the CSO1-A standard differed from CSO1 only in having a 0.9% limit for adventitious presence of GM varieties.

Mr McNair said growers delivering against either standard must declare the variety upon delivery.
